"Hito Hata", meaning "to raise a single banner," was a common expression used by Issei (first generation Japanese immigrants) to maintain the pride and hope needed to survive in a foreign land.

Starring Mako, "Hito Hata" tells the story of Oda, a bachelor Issei living out his days in Little Tokyo. By flashing back to historical events such as the 1930 Nisei Week parade or the WWII Evacuation, and by focusing on current scenes of redevelopment in Little Tokyo, we come to understand and appreciate Oda's life as part of the Japanese experience in America.
